PROPERTY TAX/RENT REBATE AVAILABLE

The Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program deadline has been extended to December 31, 2021.

You are eligible to apply if you are:

- Age 65 or older
- Under age 65, with a spouse aged 65 or older
 - A widow/widower aged 50 to 64
- Permanently disabled and aged 18 to 64

Homeowners must have a household income of \$35,000 or less, and renters must have a household income of \$15,000 or less.

My office can find out if you're eligible and help you apply before the deadline.

Pitcairn Borough received \$50,000 to be partially used for Opticom lights for emergency vehicles, allowing equipped vehicles to signal traffic lights to give them the right-of-way at intersections and helping first responders reach the scene of an emergency faster when every second counts.



PENNDOT.GOV/REALID

Beginning May 3, 2023, Pennsylvanians will need a REAL ID-compliant license, identification card, or another form of federally acceptable identification (such as a valid passport or military ID) to:

- · Board domestic commercial flights.
- Enter a military base.
- Enter a federal facility that requires ID at the door.

EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE IS AVAILABLE

The Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) is available for renters of residential properties who are at risk of eviction or utility shutoffs due to hardship caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Tenants can apply for themselves or a landlord can apply on behalf of current tenant(s). Applications for the Allegheny County Rental Assistance program can be submitted online at **covidrentrelief.alleghenycounty.us/**.

GRANTS TO FIGHT BLIGHT

Wilmerding received \$30,000 to demolish 10 hazardous, unsafe properties that are tax-delinquent.

East Pittsburgh obtained \$25,000 to assist the borough in creating tools aimed at mitigating the effects of blight, including how to handle transfer of properties via land banks, conservatorships and sheriff's sales; incentives for owners to maintain their properties; and a plan for properties to be demolished.

FUNDING FOR FRESH FOOD IN OUR SCHOOLS

The following schools in the 25th Legislative District received funding from a \$973,000 grant awarded to school districts in Allegheny County to provide healthier snack options for students:

HOME HEATING HELP

The Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) is now open to help families pay their heating bills. Find information, see if you qualify and learn how to apply at https://www.dhs.pa.gov/ Services/Assistance/Pages/LIHEAP.aspx.

WEATHERIZATION

The state's Weatherization Program is available to provide an onsite energy audit to assess conditions in the house and identify the most cost-effective energy-saving measure to be installed. It is open to lowerincome households, with priority given to higher risk residents such as the elderly, individuals with disabilities and families with children. PENNIE OPEN ENROLLMENT

Open enrollment for 2022 health insurance coverage is now underway and runs through January 15, 2022. Pennsylvanians can sign up for individual health insurance coverage through Pennie, the state's health insurance marketplace, by visiting **pennie.com**.

MEDICARE OPEN ENROLLMENT

Medicare's open enrollment period ends on December 7. Medicareeligible Pennsylvanians can take advantage of the Pennsylvania Medicare Education and Decision Insight (PA MEDI, formerly APPRISE).

PA MEDI is a free program run by the Pennsylvania Department of Aging that helps older Pennsylvanians choose Medicare supplements based on their income and medical needs.
