One of my top priorities for 2020 is to support our small businesses, from Spring Garden Street to Lehigh Avenue and Ridge Avenue to Lancaster Avenue.

Last year, I helped secure state grants and investments to support the proposed West Girard Avenue Business Resource Hub, streetscape improvements on Ridge Avenue, and a supermarket development in Mantua.

Small businesses are essential to job creation and reducing poverty in our neighborhoods. That is why I am dedicated to helping them access state resources, while also sponsoring legislation that lowers the costs to start a business, encourages local hiring, boosts minority and womenowned businesses, and promotes our commercial corridors.

## Empowering children and youth experiencing homelessness

Each year, I introduce a resolution recognizing Educating Children and Youth Experiencing Homelessness Week and Red Shirt Day to raise awareness of homeless youth in Pennsylvania.

Last year, 36,823 school children in Pennsylvania experienced homelessness, many of them in Philadelphia. A 2017 report found that there were at least 569 homeless, unaccompanied youth, ages 13 to 25. These numbers continue to grow.

I plan to introduce legislation that will improve the lives and futures of children and youth experiencing homelessness, and specifically empower unaccompanied homeless minors. ### Making child care affordable

Child care is a major expense for most families. Federal, state and local governments recognize the financial burden that child care places on families and have offered subsidies, tax credits and other financial assistance to ease the burden. Even with these programs, the cost of child care can often represent a family's single largest expense. The average Pennsylvania family pays more than 15% of their income in infant child care. I am working to increase access to quality, accessible, and affordable child care by advocating for budget increases for child care and pre-k programs and legislation that can put more in your pocket through a state child and dependent care tax credit.

Have you checked the Pennsylvania Treasury's Unclaimed Property database?

Unclaimed property can include a closed bank account, uncashed checks, certificates of deposit or lost stocks and bonds sent to the state because the owner could not be found.





### **Be counted... Participate in the 2020 Census**


The census is taken once every 10 years to get an accurate count of the American population. The information gathered is used to determine how federal money is spent on infrastructure projects, emergency services, schools and programs like CHIP in each state. It also determines the number of congressional representatives for Pennsylvania in Washington, D.C.

Getting counted is easy! You may choose to respond online, by paper, or over the phone. Paper forms will be mailed to every household that hasn't responded by late March. My office can also help you.

Census day is April 1, 2020, but online responses will be accepted in March.

## **Voice your opinion. Register to vote**

Recently, several changes were made to our voting system that will hopefully make it easier for you to voice your opinion. Those changes will be in effect for the upcoming primary election, which will be held April 28. Visit www.votespa.com for more information.
