# Burns walks 155 miles to visit 5,000 homes



Keeping in touch with people back home is a prime directive for Rep. Burns, so while others may have spent their summer at the beach, Rep. Donating all his cost-of-living pay raises to charity.

Like former President Harry S. Truman, Rep. Burns knows that the buck stops at his desk. It's where he rejects efforts to raise taxes, urges fiscal conservatism that includes cracking down on welfare fraud, and decides to oppose nutty legislation like the proposed \$10-a-year gun registration fee that emanates from Philadelphia.

But in other ways, the buck also starts at Rep. Burns' desk. It's where he works to bring tens of millions of your state tax dollars back to you in the form of grants for a host of purposes, including grants to fire companies and emergency medical service providers.
