### Burns delivers for MUNICIPALITIES

#### \$585,360 to fix Croyle Twp. roads

Rep. Burns delivered **\$347,476** to repave Tunnel Street, and **\$237,884** for road paving and sidewalks in Fifficktown.

Supervisor Rich Potter said that for the past 12 years Rep. Burns has been helping the township address many needs.

### **Burns delivers for MUNICIPALITIES**

#### \$350,140 for Conemaugh Twp. repaying

Rep. Burns got a **\$350,140** grant for **Conemaugh Township** to kickstart a multi-year road repaving program after not having one for many years.

Supervisor Kurt Freidhoff said the state grant is huge.

Roadmaster/grantwriter J.D. Burns, no relation, said that Rep. Burns' help enabled the township to parlay \$150,000 in required matching funds into \$500,000.

# \$116,872 for Summerhill Borough, Forest Hills EMS

Rep. Burns delivered a **\$116,872** state grant to **Summerhill Borough** for new ballpark lighting while also upgrading Freedom Park with a gazebo, benches, sidewalks and accessibility.

The grant also enabled purchase of ballistic vests for **Forest Hills Area Ambulance/EMS**.

#### \$354,511 in EXTRA funding for three projects!

- ◆ Jackson East Taylor Sewer Authority got \$103,442 for pump station generator replacement.
- ◆ Ebensburg got \$187,250 for Ogden Tank improvements.
- ◆ Nanty Glo got \$63,819 for Edwards Street waterline replacement.

### **Burns delivers for EDUCATION**

#### \$2.89 million for improved broadband access

Rep. Burns delivered state funding to improve Cambria County facilities to increase the public's internet access:

- Cambria Library
   Association
   received a \$2 million grant.
- Bishop McCort High School received a \$897,612 grant.



# \$1.3 million for school repairs, improvements

With these grants, Rep. Burns worked to ensure school buildings are free of environmental hazards like mold or asbestos:

- Central Cambria School District got \$894,732.
- Greater Johnstown Career and Technology Center got \$266,589.
- Admiral Peary Area Vocational Technical School got \$147,527.

# \$500,000 to prepare students for jobs

Rep. Burns delivered these grants:

- Forest Hills School District got \$250,000 for seventh-, eighth- and ninth graders to obtain pre-apprenticeship training in Computer-Aided Design and Drafting and Industrial Manufacturing
- Admiral Peary AVTS got a \$239,120 grant to enhance its welding pre-apprenticeship program, including new training materials, safety gear and welding machines.

## Burns delivers for NONPROFITS

### \$48,000 for veterans with post-traumatic stress

Rep. Burns delivered a **\$48,000** state grant for **Cambria County Crime Stoppers** to purchase and train PTSD therapy dogs to help veterans and law enforcement members overcome the debilitating effects of post-traumatic stress disorder.


