


BURNS RELEASES BLUEPRINT FOR JOHNSTOWN TO PROSPER

BURNS FIGHTS FOR AMERICAN WORKERS



Burns votes to end taxes on TIPS and OVERTIME, close corporate loopholes

Seeking to make PA's tax system fairer, Rep. Burns backed a bill to eliminate state taxes on tips and overtime that would benefit workers, while closing tax loopholes for out-of-state corporations so they can't game the system.

Burns' jobs-promoting, U.S.-made steel bill passes House

Firmly committed to helping U.S. workers, Rep. Burns introduced and championed a bill to require all entities doing construction work that receive public funding or tax breaks to use American-made steel.

Burns authors, promotes American-made flags bill

Rep. Burns believes that if your PA tax dollars are buying the U.S. flags used and displayed by state government, they should be made domestically – not somewhere like China.



BURNS PROTECTS YOUR TAX DOLLARS

Bill attacks waste, fraud, abuse

Strongly intolerant of inappropriately spent or acquired funds, Rep. Burns put forth a bill to allow PA to recoup money from Medicaid fraud and to protect whistleblowers who tip authorities to such misdeeds. This "False Claims Act" passed the House with bipartisan support.
