Dear Neighbor,

As we consider all our blessings and reflect upon the past year, I am thankful for the successes we achieved together. I sponsored several bills that were voted into law in 2023, including:

- ✓ Act 14: Requires PA's public colleges to offer continued in-state tuition rates to students who leave the state due to military orders but who continue their enrollment at the institution.
- ✓ Act 22: Establishes a task force to explore combatting high flood insurance premiums.
- Act 31: Ensures dignity and respect for patients by requiring informed consent for invasive bodily exams performed under anesthesia.
- Act 47: Ensures dignity for incarcerated pregnant and post-partum women by requiring the provision of appropriate hygiene products and traumainformed care, and limiting use of restraints.

I also voted in favor of measures enacted in 2023 that:

- ✓ Expand eligibility for the **Property Tax/Rent Rebate** Program (Act 7).
- ✓ Increase fair funding for our schools (Act 1A).
- ✓ Provide universal free breakfast for public school students (Act 33).
- Help address the PA teacher shortage (Act 35).

Additionally, I voted for a number of bills passed by the House that still await consideration by the Senate. Highlights include measures that would:

- Raise the minimum wage (HB1500).
- Protect workers' rights to organize a union (HB950).
- Increase workplace safety protections (HB299).
- Allow survivors of childhood sexual abuse to pursue justice (HB1 & HB2).
- Protect Pennsylvanians from discrimination (HB300).

- Implement commonsense gun safety protections (HB1018 & HB714).
- · Create tax credits for working families (HB1272).
- Increase public transit funding (HB1219).

I am truly grateful for my family, my wonderful staff, and for the opportunity to serve the people of 162nd District. I look forward to building on our successes in 2024 working with all interested parties to create better jobs, better schools, stronger and safer communities, and a brighter future for all our children.

Investments in the Community

I was proud to help bring in **nearly \$2 million in grants and funding** for projects and organizations in our district over the past year.

Maintaining the infrastructure that gives us access to clean water and helps prevent flooding is always a sound investment of state dollars. Our local townships and boroughs received financial relief from the commonwealth to support the following public health and safety efforts:

- ▶ \$603,750 to **Ridley Township** for a sanitary sewer system inflow/infiltration abatement project in the Crum Lynne area, and \$100,000 for stormwater system improvements.
- ▶ \$165,538 to **Darby Township** for rehabilitation of 23 manholes in township roads.
- ➤ \$350,000 to **Folcroft Borough** to clean and televise sanitary sewer lines.
- ▶ \$200,000 to **Norwood Borough** for rehabilitation of 23 manholes in borough roads, and \$200,000 to upgrade the antiquated stormwater system near Muckinipattis Creek.
- ▶ \$150,000 to **Rutledge Borough** to rehabilitate its storm sewer system.

It's vital to the overall health and well-being of our community that our brave first responders have the necessary resources to respond to emergency situations. I am proud to have helped bring this grant money home to the district and continue to pursue every available avenue to provide our local Fire and EMS operations with the tools they need to thrive:

- ► \$13,089 to Darby Township Volunteer Fire Co. #44.
- ▶ \$25,000 to Folcroft Fire Company.
- ► \$15,000 to Folsom Fire Company.
- ► \$14,808 to Glenolden Fire Company.

- ► \$15,000 to Holmes Fire Company.
- ▶ \$12,106 to Milmont Fire Company.
- ▶ \$24,317 to Norwood Fire Company.
- ▶ \$15,000 to Prospect Park Fire Company.
- ▶ \$14,317 to Ridley Park Fire Company.

I also look forward to seeing the positive benefits to come from awards to organizations that provide our residents with outstanding educational programs and services:


- ▶ \$14,811 to **Norwood Public Library** to improve its facilities.
- ▶ \$115,169 to **Rosie's Girls**, a pre-apprenticeship program that partners with our local public

school districts to familiarize young women with safety, tools, and theoretical basics of electrical and telecommunications installation, and introduce them to career paths in the building and construction trades.
