Legislative Update

My resolution, HR 952, would create a task force to study remote learning

This spring, schools were thrust into a system of remote learning to protect the health of students and teachers. Unfortunately, schools didn't have the time for the necessary planning to ensure effective teaching for a diverse range of students of varying means, abilities and circumstances.

It is critical that our schools follow best practices in remote learning situations, but unfortunately, there has been little research done to identify what those would be. My goal for this task force is to remedy this gap in our knowledge. It would do this by conducting a study over the next year, which would lead to the creation of a report identifying these best practices and detailing critical factors and barriers to successful implementation of remote learning.



UNEMPLOYMENT

It's not uncommon to experience delays in navigating public resources, as the commonwealth and the U.S. are experiencing overwhelming levels of demand. Since mid-March, more than 2 million Pennsylvanians have filed for unemployment benefits.

There are two unemployment programs available: traditional Unemployment Compensation (UC) and Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA). UC covers most people, while PUA is a new program for self-employed, 'gig' and contract workers, as well as many others that may not have qualified for traditional unemployment.

REQUIREMENTS FOR PANDEMIC

Pennsylvania Department of Health Secretary Dr. Rachel Levine and Education Secretary Pedro Rivera outlined updated guidance to help Pre-K to 12 schools prepare to reopen and safely educate students. Each school entity will determine if classes resume in person at school buildings, remotely or a combination of both options.

In instances when someone from a school tests positive, state public health staff will immediately assist the school with risk assessment, isolation recommendations, and other infection control assistance.


