Serving as your voice in Harrisburg is an honor and a privilege. When I took the oath of office to begin the 2025-2026 legislative term back in January, I felt a sense of gratitude for the opportunity to serve our community.

I always have the needs of our community in mind as we debate issues on the House floor and my staff sends me an update before every floor vote on whether we've gotten calls or emails from our neighbors supporting or opposing the bill, and how many. My legislative priorities are focused on protecting people and the economic health of our region. Bringing state grant funding back to our community is among my top priorities and I make sure that the municipalities across our district all have someone fighting for their projects in Harrisburg. Our most important work happens in the district, where my staff and I help thousands of neighbors cut through government bureaucracy and red tape.

### **Crozer-Chester Medical Center Updates on My Website**

Crozer-Chester Medical Center is located in Upland Borough, which was drawn into the 161st District in 2022. For the past three years, I have been standing up to Prospect Medical Holdings, the California-based hedge fund that has extracted resources from our hospital system to line their own pockets. After facing a lawsuit by the Pennsylvania Attorney General's office, Prospect filed for bankruptcy in January 2025 and a bankruptcy judge in Texas is now overseeing the case.

I am working closely with the offices of Governor Josh Shapiro, the Pennsylvania Attorney General, Delaware County Council, the three unions that represent the workers at Crozer, and the rest of Delaware County's legislative delegation toward a resolution to Prospect's bankruptcy filing and a long-term solution for Crozer Health. All of us are fighting hard to save access to health care in our community. # **MY LEGISLATION**

Here's a snapshot of bills I have introduced this session. For more information on the legislation I am sponsoring, visit RepLeanne.com and click on "NEWS, Bills I've Introduced" in the navigation bar.

#### Ensuring access to contraceptives for women across PA (HB1140)

Since taking office, I have fought for women's reproductive health and rights. I recently reintroduced my bill that would require all health insurance policies in Pennsylvania to provide coverage for all FDA-approved contraceptive drugs, devices, products and services.

#### Stopping workplace violence against healthcare workers (HB926)

Did you know that workplace violence is more frequent in healthcare than any other industry? Healthcare workers accounted for a staggering 73% of all non-fatal workplace injuries and illnesses due to violence in 2018 alone. I reintroduced this legislation that will create the Healthcare Workplace Violence Prevention Act, keeping ALL our healthcare workers safe and cared for.

#### Capping fees for electronic medical records (HB1104)

As a legislator, I owe a duty to Pennsylvanians to enact laws that will make their lives simpler and keep costs down. I reintroduced this bill to cap the costs of obtaining electronic medical records.

#### Prohibiting wildlife trafficking in Pennsylvania (HB994)

Iconic animal species such as elephants, tigers, sea turtles and giraffes face extinction due to the demand for their hides and other body parts. I reintroduced this legislation to prohibit the sale of at-risk animal products and parts to ensure that Pennsylvanians aren't unwittingly contributing to illegal wildlife trafficking. We'll work together to reduce demand in PA.

#### Fighting for water utility customers

No one wants high water and sewer bills, decreased services or outdated infrastructure! That's why I'm working to amend the Water Services Act so that residents have a voice in the process when public water systems like the Chester Water Authority go up for private sale. The bill package to address this is currently in development.

- \$304,000 for Blackrock Park in Ridley Township
- \$378,960 for Chester Creek Rail Trail Expansion in Middletown
- \$400,000 for Chester Township for Ida storm recovery
- \$750,000 for Hedgerow Theatre for ADA renovations
- \$818,376 for Chester Upland School District
- \$1.1 MILLION for Aston Township's new police station and municipal building

Don't let delay derail your travels! Beginning May 7, Pennsylvanians



will need a REAL ID to board flights and enter military bases or a federal facility that require ID (if you don't have a U.S. Passport). A REAL ID isn't mandatory, but it may come in handy.
