

lectricity providers like Penelec understand that the pandemic has created additional challenges for residents and small business owners, and the company offers flexible solutions to help customers keep the power on. If you are struggling with heating payments, I encourage you to contact Penelec at 1-(800) 545-7741 to explore the company's available payment plans and bill assistance programs. In addition, you may be eligible for state assistance through the Low-Income Household Energy Assistance Program. Eligible residents can have a one-time cash grant ranging from \$200 to \$1,000 sent directly to their heating company, and those in danger of having their heating service terminated may also qualify for crisis benefits of up to \$800.To find out if you qualify and to apply, visit www.dhs.pa.gov and scroll down to the "LIHEAP" heading, or call 866-857-7095 for more information.
