
DISTRACTED DRIVER CRASHES

- On average, there are over <u>14,000</u> distracted driving crashes in Pennsylvania each year.
- From 2016 to 2021, there were <u>9,757</u> distracted driving crashes in Allegheny, Beaver and Lawrence Counties.
- <u>27 people</u> lost their lives in these crashes.



In 2016 Daniel's Law was passed in Pennsylvania, named after Daniel Gallatin (Lawrence County) who was killed in 2013 when his motorcycle was struck by someone who was texting while driving.

The Law:

- It is illegal to send, write or read any text-based message on a cell phone or computer while driving.
- This is a primary offense.
- Penalties are increased for texting drivers convicted of vehicular homicide or involuntary manslaughter, similarly to drunk drivers.
- Points are added to violators' driving records.




DRIVE SAFE




- Stay alert and avoid distractions
- Park the phone
- Apply your settings before leaving
- Only drive with responsible passengers





- Effective April 27, 2021 Replaces 'Steer Clear Law'
- Move over to a lane not adjacent to emergency vehicles with lights activated
- If impossible to move over, slow down to up to 20 MPH below speed limit
- Disabled vehicle with hazard lights <u>AND</u> flares or other traffic control device (cones, triangles, etc.)
 - approach the same way





Acceptable if driver slows down up to 20 MPH below speed limit



Police: 2 men killed in parkway crash had just returned with gas for disabled vehicle



- Penalties
 - -1^{st} offense = $\frac{500 + 2}{500}$ points
 - -2^{nd} offense = \$1,000 + 2 points
 - 3rd offense = \$2,000, 90 day suspended license
 - Fines doubled for traffic violations
 - Injure or kill someone on scene = \$10,000
 - Aggravated assault by vehicle
 - Homicide by vehicle
 - 6 month suspended license



On April 22nd, Clintonville, PA Firefighter Justin Williams, 25, was providing traffic control for a multi-vehicle accident on the I-80 bridge in Venango County, which spans over the Allegheny River when he was struck & severely injured by an out-of-control commercial vehicle. He is currently hospitalized in critical but stable condition.




Pennsylvania Responder Struck-By Fatalities (All Time)
