Getting Around During SEPTA Service Cuts (Updated August 22, 2025)

What's changing (and when)?

 August 24: ~20% fewer trips on buses and Metro (Broad Street Line, Market-Frankford Line, trolleys). 32 bus routes eliminated or shortened; many others run less often.

Starting January 2026: Deeper cuts - Route 32 & 44 eliminated, BSL & MFL close at 9 p.m., trolley shutdowns.



"Sports Express" and other special event trains are suspended

- September 1: Average fare increase of ~21.5% (base transit fare rising to \$2.90)
- September 2: Regional Rail begins reduced schedules

Alternatives for Getting Around

The City has issued a mitigation plan (traffic management, walking/biking support)

- Park & Ride
 - The city has created <u>this map</u> to show park and ride lots near transit for access into Center City
- Share-A-Ride:
 - Carpool Service. <u>Share-A-Ride Home</u>
- Taxis:
 - Dispatch numbers include 215-666-6666 or 215-333-3333
- Uber Route Share:
 - Route Share rides run on set schedules along busy commuter corridors, with pickups every 20 minutes during rush hours (6 a.m. to 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. to 8 p.m.). Fares are advertised as up to 50% cheaper than UberX but require riders to walk to a pickup point and share the ride with up to two others.
- Bike Share
 - Indego Bike Share Program:
 - Try Indego Bike share program for \$1 a month for throughout the month of September by using the promo code "indecycle25"
 - Additional Info/Plans:
 - **Single Ride:** \$4.50 for one 30-minute ride on a classic bike. (E-bikes: extra 30 cents per minute; rides over 30 minutes: extra 30 cents per minute.)
 - **Guest Pass:** \$15 for 24 hours of unlimited 60-minute rides on classic bikes. (E-bikes: extra 20 cents per minute; rides over 60 minutes: extra 20 cents per minute.)
 - Indego30: \$20 per month for unlimited 60-minute rides on classic bikes. (E-bikes: extra 20 cents per minute; rides over 60 minutes: 20 cents per minute.)
 - Indego365: \$156 per year (\$13 per month) for unlimited 60-minute rides on classic bikes. (E-bikes: extra 20 cents per minute; rides over 60 minutes: extra 20 cents per minute.)
 - Indego365 Plus: \$230 per year (\$19.17 per month) with two 30-minute e-bike rides included daily, then 20 cents per minute for additional e-bike time.







Alternatives for Specific Impacted Groups

Students & Families

- SEPTA has created a <u>Student Impact Guide</u> that highlights shows the impact of cuts and alternative routes for schools and universities
- Parent Flat Rate Program:
 - Apply by October 1st 2025
 - This program provides a monthly payment to eligible parents who choose to opt out of District bus, van or cab assignments and instead drive their child to and from school.
 - All registered families will receive \$300 per month (\$3,000 for the school year) for transporting their child to and from school.

Seniors & Individuals with Disabilities

- SEPTA Shared Ride Program (SRP)
 - SRP is a door-to-door ridesharing service offered on a spaceavailable basis with limited driver assistance.
 - This service is for any Philadelphia resident who is 65 or older.
 Reservations must be made in advance.
 - The service is for travel within the City of Philadelphia, and to anywhere within three miles of the city's border (Bucks, Montgomery and Delaware counties). For Shared-Ride Programs outside of the City of Philadelphia, contact your county's coordinator.

 - Registered Shared-Ride customers pay \$4.25 for a one-way trip within the service region
 - To register for the Shared-Ride Program:
 - Complete <u>the application form</u>
 - Applications are also available in your state legislator's office
 - Attach copy of one acceptable form of proof of age
 - Schedule an appointment to go to 1234 Market to receive your SEPTA Access Key card
 - Call SEPTA Access Customer Service at 215-580-7145 (8a-5p, M-F) to schedule an appointment







- SEPTA ADA Paratransit Service (SEPTA Access)
 - The SEPTA Access (formerly known as CCT Connect) program provides paratransit service for individuals with disabilities who are functionally unable to use regular routes for their transportation needs.
 - Registered paratransit customers pay \$4.25 for a one-way trip within the service region. An additional \$0.75 charge may apply if the trip is more than three miles into an adjacent county or if the trip is more than 10 miles. Not more than \$5 total will be charged.
 - To register for ADA Paratransit:
 - Call SEPTA Access Customer Service at **215-580-7145** (8a-5p, M-F).
 - You must be pre-screened by a customer service rep. The rep will mail you an application or you can print an application (PDF)
 - Once you return your completed application, a rep will schedule your functional assessment.

Medical Appointments & Caregivers

- Medical Assistance Transportation Program
 - The <u>Medical Assistance Transportation Program</u> (MATP) is a shared ride transportation service available to people receiving Medical Assistance and is paid for by the <u>Pennsylvania Department of</u> <u>Human Services</u> (DHS)
 - You can use MATP rides to go to medical appointments, the pharmacy, or to any service covered by Medical Assistance.
