My staff can help senior citizens and other residents who qualify for the state's Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program.

Applications were available starting Feb. 11 to apply for the Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program.

Pennsylvanians 65 or older, widows and widowers 50 or older, and people with permanent disabilities 18 or older may qualify for the benefits under the program. The annual income limit for homeowners is \$35,000 and \$15,000 for renters. When calculating your annual income, you only need to count 50 percent of your Social Security income, and Social Security COLAS are excluded. The maximum standard rebate is \$650.

SAVE MONEY ON YOUR MEDICARE COVERAGE

Do you know everything you need to know about your coverage? Did you know there are programs that could help you save money on your monthly premiums? My office is here to help. Beginning Feb. 17, my office's volunteer benefits counselor is available the third Tuesday of every month from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. The session will take about an hour. ENROLL ON THE DO-NOT-CALL LIST

Unwanted telemarketing calls are one of the most frustrating things people have to deal with. The good news is that Pennsylvania maintains a free Do-Not-Call List that can help you avoid most telemarketing calls.

To see if you are enrolled, please call my district office at 610-791-6270 and a member of my staff can help you. If you are not enrolled and would like to be added to the list, my office will be able to address that, too!

Here are a few things to keep in mind:

By signing up for Pennsylvania's list, you will automatically be added to the national Do-Not-Call list.

This is a rolling enrollment; individuals may sign up at any time and registration is good for five years. After that, people need to re-enroll to remain on the active list.

If you continue to receive unwanted telemarketing phone calls, complaints can be filed with the Bureau of Consumer Protection in the Attorney General's Office by calling 1-800-441-2555.

The law does not prevent telemarketers from calling folks with whom they had an established business relationship within 12 months preceding the call. Telemarketers calling on behalf of charities, government or politics are exempted from this law.

- Citations from the Pennsylvania House of Representatives for outstanding accomplishments and family milestones
- Complaints or questions about utilities and the Public Utility Commission
- Complaints and problems with insurance companies
- Renewal of state-issued licenses or certifications

- Problems or questions about the state lottery
- PACE cards for senior citizens
- Consumer complaints
- Liquor Control Board concerns or questions
- Tours of the state Capitol for individuals or groups
- Information about federal, state and local government agencies
