Swearing-In Day Honored to serve my community

On January 3rd, I had the honor to be sworn in once again as State Representative for the 192nd Legislative District. This is the 207th Legislative Session, the largest and most diverse class of freshmen legislators in over a decade, with 26 new Democratic members. In the Democratic Caucus, there are 35 women and 34 people of color.

I am looking forward to this session and working to advance legislation to improve the lives of hard-working families, improve access to high-quality care and services, strengthen public safety, and reduce crime.

After the Thanksgiving holiday, the General Assembly got together in Harrisburg to select our leadership team for the 2023-24 legislative session. I am honored to have been elected Chairwoman of the Philadelphia House Delegation.

Policy Highlight – Wins of the Women's

Health Caucus

At the start of the 2020 session, I was appointed to serve as the House Democratic Co-Chair of the Women's Health Caucus (WHC). The WHC is a bipartisan, bicameral caucus committed to addressing women's health issues.

Still unsure of what the COVID-19 pandemic meant for us, my colleagues and I hit the ground running, attempting to reframe the purpose of the caucus. We strongly believe that there's much more to women's health than abortion.

We were able to take a closer look at all the issues women and families face and identify a platform based on maternal health, childcare access, reproductive healthcare, and justice. At the height of the pandemic, we looked at how "the great resignation" impacted women and their families. We upheld transparent relationships with stakeholders, held meetings and hearings, and worked closely with Governor Tom Wolf and his Administration. Here's what we were able to accomplish:

- Expand Medical Assistance from 6 weeks to 1 year postpartum (as of 4/1/22)
- Form the PA Doula Advisory Commission (PADAC)
- Implement a pathway to certification for doulas in the Commonwealth - PA Perinatal Doula Certification launched February 2022
- Bring doula care into state correctional institutions Muncy and Cambridge Springs in a strategic partnership between the PA Department of Corrections and the Department of Human Services – Doula Pilot Program, launched February 2022



- Allocate \$25 million in ARP State Fiscal Recovery Funds to improving maternal health in PA through programs such as:
 - > \$5 million for Maternal Care Innovation Grants
 - \$200K for Grants for Maternal Mortality Review Committees
 - \$700K to expanding access to doula care with funds for Doula Certification & Training and PADOC Doula Services

I was ecstatic to stand with Councilmember Curtis Jones Jr. and other City officials to honor Wynnefield's living legend, Lady B, at the street renaming of Wyndale Avenue.





54th Street Food Truck Festival Aug. 20 | Wynnefield

I joined Councilmember Curtis Jones Jr. and the Wynnefield Overbrook Revitalization Corporation to host the 54th Street Food Truck Festival. We welcomed some of Philly's favorite eateries to West Philadelphia for a day of festivities and resources to prepare students and families for the school year.



Cassidy Elementary Groundbreaking Oct. 16 | Overbrook

It was an exciting moment to join Senator Vincent Hughes and Councilmember Curtis Jones Jr., along with members of the School District of Philadelphia, students, and families of Cassidy Elementary School to break ground for a brandnew school building. This project is several years in the making, and I can't wait for what's to come!
