WHAT IS REAL ID?

As of **May 7, 2025**, in order to board a domestic flight, enter a military base, or enter a federal facility requiring federally acceptable ID, you will need either a Real ID or Passport. To get your Real ID, you must go to the DMV and present the following:

- One document proving identity and lawful status.
- One document proving your Social Security number.
- Two documents proving your Pennsylvania residency.

NOTE: Official certificates (birth/marriage) **MUST** have a raised seal. If your last name was changed due to marriage, your official marriage certificate must be presented.
