At the Capitol last year, I co-sponsored 236 bills designed to improve education, safety, health, and the lives of residents across the district and Commonwealth.

There were challenges in passing a timely budget, but the end product was a balanced, bipartisan plan without any tax increases or reductions in the Rainy Day Fund. The budget includes increased investments in education, housing and homelessness prevention, transportation infrastructure, maternal health initiatives, and food security programs. While there is always more work to be done, these budget wins provide a stronger foundation for our communities and show what is possible when we put people first.

**As we begin 2026, my priorities continue to be supporting our education system and expanding childcare access, improving mental and physical healthcare for Pennsylvanians, and enacting measures to ensure a strong quality of life for all of you.**



# FUNDING FOR PROJECTS IN OUR COMMUNITY



- **\$555,000 to expand multipurpose areas and increase the Friendship YMCA's capacity for programming.** Once completed, these improvements will allow up to 150 additional youth and teens to participate in mentoring and leadership programs and provide for 200 more seniors to engage in workforce development, learning, and social activities.
- **\$400,000 to the Children's Advocacy Centers of Pennsylvania** to support local centers, provide specialized construction and training for counties that do not yet have a CAC, and cover essential operational needs.
- **\$376,000 to the Susquehanna Township Authority** for the construction of Phase 1 of the Wedgewood Hills Park, which includes expanding parking areas with ADA-designated spaces, a new age-segregated playground, pavement games, and more.
- **\$300,000 to Friends of Union Green** for the construction of a public green space to provide the community with a year-round recreational space for public gatherings and events.
- **\$75,000 to The Central Pennsylvania Food Bank** to purchase a refrigerated truck that will serve a 14-county area.
- **\$72,165 to Susquehanna Township** to support the Beaufort Hunt Playground.
- **\$50,000 to Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, Inc.** to construct secure two-door entrances for the Interfaith Shelter and Evergreen House in Lower Paxton Township.

## ACKNOWLEDGING DIABETES AWARENESS MONTH IN PENNSYLVANIA

The House recently adopted my resolution with Rep. Natalie Mihalek commemorating November 2025 as "Diabetes Awareness Month in Pennsylvania."

My daughter is one of 34 million people across the United States living with diabetes. She was diagnosed in June 2020 when a visit to her pediatrician was followed by a trip to the Emergency Department at Penn State Hershey.

As a lawmaker, I will always use my platform to spread awareness about the struggle those living with diabetes face every day. By adopting this resolution, we're shining a light on the reality that many Pennsylvanians face and helping them feel seen.
