

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

In 2025, I personally prime sponsored 35 bills and 9 resolutions, and I co-sponsored an additional 118 bills and 22 resolutions!

The PA House works together to pass legislation that improves our communities. Here are some highlights:

SENT TO THE SENATE

HB 1628

PROTECTING VACCINE ACCESS IN PENNSYLVANIA

Ensures all Pennsylvanians, especially those susceptible to preventable illnesses and diseases, **have access to vaccines.**

Sealing Eviction Records

to Protect Tenants & Communities

Requires eviction information for all cases to be placed under limited access after seven years have elapsed since the filing of the case.

The new Working Pennsylvanians Tax Credit went into effect as part of the 2025-26 budget approval. It offers eligible families an even greater income tax refund.

The PA Crown Act amends the Pennsylvania Human Relations Act to prohibit discrimination based on a person's hair type, hair texture, or hairstyle.

Helping Veterans Continue to Serve

Allows a veteran's service experience in an occupation or trade to count towards that veteran's qualifications to be a Career & Technical Education Instructor and help get students vital job training.

Act 41 of 2025, formerly H.B. 1405, addresses the ongoing teacher shortage in Pennsylvania by making it easier for veterans to obtain a teaching certificate in career and technical fields. Many veterans gain direct experience in CTE fields during their time in the service.
