Stopping sexual extortion

In May 2019, I introduced H.B. 1402 with Rep. Tedd C. Nesbit, R-Mercer/Butler, to outlaw sexual extortion in Pennsylvania and empower law enforcement and victim services organizations to help victims of this serious sex crime who previously fell between the cracks.

I was overjoyed when this legislation unanimously passed both the House and Senate and was sent to the governor for approval in November. When Gov. Tom Wolf signed H.B. 1402 into law as Act 100 of 2019, Pennsylvania joined a growing list of states to outlaw this heinous crime.

Finally, victims of the horrific crime of sexual extortion will have an avenue to seek justice, and perpetrators of sexual extortion – which the Department of Justice has said is the most significantly growing threat to children – can be held accountable.



Crucial criminal justice reform legislation

On the last legislative day of the decade, my Justice Reinvestment Act 2 legislation was signed into law! It will reduce costs within the Department of Corrections and then use those savings to reduce recidivism, increase public safety and help get people back on their feet.

Two other crucial pieces of legislation that are in step with JRI2 are H.B. 440, which would provide for the automatic expungement of an individual's pardon or full acquittal, and H.R. 619, which calls for a study on the funding of indigent criminal defense. Pursuant to H.R. 619, the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee will conduct a comprehensive study on sources of funding and caseload sizes regarding indigent legal defense in each county and hopefully return their findings later this year. Additionally, I hope the Senate acts on H.B. 440 in the near future so we can get this important legislation signed into law for the betterment of us all.

Congratulations to William Penn School District! And know that I will keep fighting for our children and for fair education funding!



Every 10 years, the United States conducts a census. This count of U.S. residents helps determine how \$675 billion is spent by the federal government and how Pennsylvania is represented in



Congress for the next 10 years.

Visit 2020Census.gov beginning April 1 to make sure you're counted in the 2020 census.

Do you need a REAL ID?

Beginning Oct. 1, 2020, Pennsylvanians will need a REAL IDcompliant driver's license, photo ID card, or another form of federally acceptable identification (such as a valid passport or military



ID) to board a domestic flight or enter a secure federal building or military installation.
