My office can help!

If you're wondering how a state representative's office can help you, the following is a list of our most requested items. We can help you with...

- SEPTA Key Senior ID Card photos and applications.
- Car registrations, special tags, disability placards, titles and driver's license applications.
- Information on financial assistance for higher education.
- Obtaining and completing state forms of all kinds.
- Unemployment compensation, disability and workers' compensation.
- Troubleshooting issues or delays with Department of Human Services (food stamps, medical and income assistance).
- PA state income tax questions or problems.
- Complaints or issues with insurance companies.
- Renewal of state-issued licenses or certifications.
- Property Tax/Rent Rebate forms for seniors, widows, widowers and people with disabilities.
- PACE cards for seniors.
- Liquor Control Board concerns and questions.
- Citations honoring local people for outstanding accomplishments or family milestones.
- Information about any state or local government agency.
- Answers to questions about the Veterans Property Tax Exemption.
- Maps and information about our local communities.

In short, we can help with any state government issue!

Information for car registration, licenses

Not knowing what you need and what to bring to the Department of Motor Vehicles after you move can be stressful. Please contact my office at (215) 493-5420 if you need forms or information. We can help.

If you are moving from within PA:

You must report your change of address within 15 days of moving. You can change your address online for the driver's license/photo ID and vehicle/trailer registration, OR you can complete the MV-63 (Change of Address).

If you are moving from out-of-state to PA:

For driver's licenses, if you have an out-of-state license, you have 60 days to get a PA license. You must appear in person at a Driver's License Center and surrender your out-of-state license (valid or expired 6 months or less), take an eye test and complete a DL-180R. You will also have to show proof of identification and residency and your Social Security card.

Out-of-state learner's permits cannot be transferred to PA. If your out-of-state license is expired by more than 6 months, it cannot be transferred, and you must apply for a PA Learner's Permit and complete all knowledge and skills tests.

For titling and registration, apply for a PA title and registration within 20 days. You must have a valid form of PA ID. The out-of-state title must be surrendered to PennDOT, and the MV-1 must be completed by an authorized PennDOT agent. To title and register your vehicle, please bring with you to the authorized PennDOT agent:

- A valid title for all vehicles you wish to register in PA, issued in your name, from your previous state.
- Proof of PA insurance.
- Vehicle Identification Number.
- Form of payment for appropriate title, lien, registration fees and sales tax.

If you are titling and registering a leased vehicle, the leasing company must complete the MV-1L.






Tours of our state Capitol

President Teddy Roosevelt proclaimed our state Capitol the "handsomest building" he ever saw upon its dedication in 1906. Philadelphia architect Joseph Huston, the son of Irish immigrants and a Princeton University graduate, designed the Capitol's 272-foot dome, modeling it after Rome's St. Peter's Basilica. The backdrop of the Capitol's central rotunda features a grand staircase modeled after the one in the Palais Garnier – or the Paris Opera House. Huston incorporated various Renaissance designs throughout the House, Senate and Governor's Reception Room.



Voting info

General info: Go to https://www.vote.pa.gov.
You can look up your polling location, find your
voter status, register to vote, change your
address, request an absentee or mail-in ballot, watch a demo
about the voting system in Bucks County and more.

Registration requirements: You must be a US citizen for at least 30 days before an election. You must be a resident of PA for at least 30 days before an election. You must be at least 18 years old on the day of the election. You must provide your driver's license number, PennDOT ID number or the last four digits of your Social Security number.

Polls: Open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Primary and General Election days.

Election schedule: Primary elections in PA are held on the third Tuesday of May in most years. In presidential election years, the primary election is held on the fourth Tuesday of April. General elections are always held on the Tuesday after the first Monday in November.
