Dear neighbor,

Being your State Representative is the honor of my life. It has been a busy couple of months in Harrisburg and the district as I worked to pass the state's budget, authored legislation, and fought against injustices such as the decision to overturn Roe v. Wade. We are living in tough times, and I

want you to know that I am doing everything in my power to fight for you, your rights and the rights of Pennsylvanians all across the commonwealth. Read this newsletter to see what I'm doing to improve our district and the commonwealth!

Important Legislation Introduced This Session

Increasing Financial Assistance to Families and Households in Need

In order to provide critical financial assistance to qualified households in need, I have introduced legislation with state Sen. Katie Muth to modernize the TANF program. Going forward, to ensure that TANF benefits continue to be effective at providing financial stability, this legislation would require an annual cost of living increase to keep pace with inflation. This legislation would increase the monthly benefit amount to bring families up to 50% of the federal poverty level and out of deep poverty, a serious life improving measure for these families and their children's futures.



PA Women's Health Protection Act

In light of the Dobbs decision overturning Roe v. Wade, I introduced legislation with state Rep. Morgan Cephas to ban Pennsylvania from imposing undue regulations on women's reproductive healthcare. Onerous restrictions, such as requiring women to undergo state mandated counseling prior to receiving healthcare they have already decided

they want, would no longer be allowed in our state. We cannot be a state where all Pennsylvanians can thrive until all Pennsylvanians have access to their constitutional rights and bodily autonomy.

The right to choose what one does with their body cannot be negotiable in Pennsylvania.

Sedition-Free Pennsylvania

Our democracy is constantly being threatened by elected officials who continuously share misinformation and create distrust, fear and ignorance within our communities. This sedition should have no place in Pennsylvania's governing bodies. For this reason, I joined my colleague state Rep. Chris Rabb in introducing legislation to eliminate sedition in our great state and ensure that our elected officials are held accountable for actions they take against our democracy.

Budget

We passed the state budget for 2022-2023 in early July. While there are elements of this budget that I'm deeply concerned about, such as Earned Income Tax Credit expansion and huge corporate tax cuts, it overall does a lot of good. It includes the biggest investment in public education in Pennsylvania history, an expansion of the Property Tax/Rent Rebate Program, millions of dollars for a Whole Home Repairs program to give grants to low-income families, and \$1 million for Hunger Free Campuses, legislation that I co-sponsored. These are all top priorities for the 181st District, and I am pleased to see funding invested in addressing these issues.

Combating Gun Violence

The rates of gun violence that we are witnessing in our city, state and country are absolutely sickening! In 2021, Philadelphia had over 500 homicides and is on track to pass that number by the end of 2022. We have witnessed countless mass shootings across the country in places like Uvalde, Buffalo, Highland Park and South Philadelphia.

My Democratic colleagues and I have introduced several pieces of legislation to combat gun violence, such as background checks, assault weapons bans and raising the minimum age to purchase a firearm.



As we are attempting to protect Pennsylvanians from gun violence, our colleagues in the Republican Party are doing everything in their power to ignore gun violence. They have even attempted to make it easier to access a firearm. More people across Pennsylvania will continue to die from gun violence as a consequence of the majority party's inaction.

I have attended events throughout our community to speak with those who have had to live through the horror of gun violence. This includes a visit to our local YMCA to speak with parents, children and advocates about finding further ways to combat gun violence and keep our community safe.

In December of 2021, I held a press conference to call on Philadelphia Mayor Jim Kenney and Governor Tom Wolf to declare a state of emergency on gun violence. Along with this, I proposed a three-point plan that I believe can help prevent gun violence. The three steps include:

- 1) Declaring a state of emergency.
- 2) Passing stalled gun safety legislation.
- 3) Addressing root causes of violence and investing in our youth.

Even though Republicans refuse to address gun violence, you can count on me to continue fighting for gun safety legislation and to keep our communities safe for everybody! We will get through this, there are too many good people fighting this good fight!
