#### A. Brief Concept

Requires Fentanyl and Xylazine testing be added to urine drug screens in hospitals.

### C. Analysis of the Bill

Senate Bill 683 requires fentanyl and xylazine be added to any diagnostic urine drug screening panel conducted in a general acute care hospital. The bill requirement does not apply to specialty hospitals.

Hospitals are permitted to use fentanyl and xylazine test strips, if they do not have equipment to analyze urine screens.

Positive fentanyl and xylazine tests must be deidentified so the patient's name is not connected to the result, and reported to the Department of Health via the National Electronic Disease Surveillance System (PA-NEDSS).

#### **Effective Date:**

60 days.

#### G. Relevant Existing Laws

No existing law requires specific drug screening as part of a urine drug test.

- 19 precursor included in Schedules I through V of The Controlled
- 20 Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act.
- 21 "PA-NEDSS." Pennsylvania's version of the National
- 22 <u>Electronic Disease Surveillance System.</u>
- 23 "Urine drug screening." A chemical analysis intended to test
- 24 a patient for the presence of a controlled substance.
- 25 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
