With a B.S. from Massachusetts Institute of Technology and an MBA from the Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania, I am a finance professional with experience in investment analysis, planning and analysis, and corporate strategy.

## Working For You

Being a state representative means wearing many hats. Among the most obvious is writing and voting on legislation. Here are some of my bills and resolutions:

**Blockchain Technology Bill Package:** This spring, I formed the bipartisan Emerging Technologies Caucus with the purpose of helping our legislature keep pace with rapid tech growth. This summer, I introduced H.B. 1370 and H.R. 121 as a Blockchain



Technology Bill Package, which would establish a two-year financial technology sandbox program and a blockchain working group tasked to create a master plan for the growth of the blockchain industry in Pennsylvania, including developing appropriate recommendations for new laws and regulations.



**Establishing County Jail Oversight Boards:** I introduced H.B. 343 to close a loophole and require counties of the Second Class A, such as Montgomery County, to establish a county jail oversight board in a similar fashion

to counties of the second class. These oversight boards have the authority to make significant changes regarding how jails in their respective counties operate. In short, it would allow greater accountability in our criminal justice system.

**Increasing Access to Cancer Screenings:** Undergoing regular screening tests is the most reliable way to detect cancer early, when it's small and hasn't yet spread. Regular tests may find breast, cervical and colon cancers early, when treatment is likely to work best. Lung cancer screening is recommended for some at high risk. So, I've introduced legislation to expand the age eligibility for low-income uninsured and underinsured individuals to access cancer screenings, ensuring access to these crucial services and providing a better chance of beating cancer for many more at-risk individuals.

If you have questions about or need assistance with any of the following topics, I have great news. We are here to help!

For notary services, constituent services advisor Julian Morein recently achieved notary status! That means if you are a resident of the 154th Legislative

District, you can have most official state documents notarized **FOR FREE**. Just call ahead (215-572-5210) or email ([RepNelson@pahouse.net](mailto:RepNelson@pahouse.net)) to make sure Julian is in the office and that we can accommodate the work you are requesting.

A reminder: The person whose signature is to be notarized must: 1. Sign the document in the presence of the notary; 2. Provide proof of identity, such as a valid driver's license, photo ID or passport; 3. Let staff know if witnesses are needed.
